Philippine Board of Radiology Examination II (PBRE II)

Written examination in clinical subjects in radiology: cardiovascular, neuroradiology and head and neck, musculoskeletal, urinary tract and male reproductive system, pulmonary, gastrointestinal and abdominal, pediatric, women's and breast imaging.

Philippine Board of Radiology Examination III (PBRE III)

Oral and practical examination in clinical subjects in radiology: cardiovascular, neuroradiology and head and neck, musculoskeletal, urinary tract and male reproductive system, pulmonary, gastrointestinal and abdominal, pediatric, women's and breast imaging.

ELIGIBILITY AND REQUIREMENTS

Eligibility to take the Philippine Board of Radiology Examination Part II (PBRE II)

Applicants who passed PBRE I and finished four years of Residency Training in Diagnostic Radiology in a PCR-Accredited institution.

Applicants who passed PBRE I and will complete their four years of Residency Training in Diagnostic Radiology in a PCR-Accredited institution and fulfill all requirements set by the training institution and Philippine College of Radiology Residency Training Council within sixty (60) days after the reference date of the PBRE II.

Eligibility to take the Philippine Board of Radiology Examination Part III (PBRE III)

Applicants who passed PBRE I and PBRE II.

Requirements for the Philippine Board of Radiology Examination Part II and III

- Duly accomplished Application Form.
- Three (3) passport size photos taken within the last six (6) months.
- PBR Certification/letter for passing PBRE I.
- Endorsement letter from the Chairman and the Training Officer of the training institution where the applicant completed the Residency Training in Diagnostic Radiology.
- Clearance and endorsement letter from the Hospital Medical Director or the Director for Training of the institution.
- RTC Clearance from the PCR Residency Training Council (RTC).
- Certificate of good standing from the Philippine Medical Association (PMA).
- Photocopy of the Professional Regulation Commission (PRC) Physician License ID.
- Notarized Application Form and Conforme.
- Application Handling Fee/ Examination Fee deposit slip.

An applicant who decides to withdraw from the examination must notify the PBR in writing not later than **four (4) weeks** before the examination date. A partial refund will be given, less a reimbursement fee of five hundred pesos (P500.00). Applicants who fail to notify the PBR after the deadline forfeits the right to get a reimbursement of the fees.

CONFORME ON ANONIMITY, RULES REGARDING CHEATING AND OTHER VIOLATIONS OF EXAMINATION REGULATIONS, AND PCR INDUCTION REQUIREMENTS

ANONYMITY CLAUSE

To ensure fairness and objectivity, the Philippine Board of Radiology (PBR) implements an anonymous system in conducting the examination in diagnostic radiology. In this system, the examinees are only identified by their code numbers during the examination and during checking. Examinees are cautioned against writing anything in the examination answer sheets that might develop examiner's sympathy or impair the examiners objectivity. It is only under good and justifiable reasons as determined by PBR that the anonymity clause may be broken.

Pursuant thereof, the following rules are to be strictly adhered and observed:

- 1) No examinee shall in the examination sheet or in any manner prior to the release of the examination results, purposely reveal to any of the examiners facts to reveal his identity, or otherwise provide information concerning the identity of the examinee.
- 2) If an examiner determines that there is probable cause that a violation of this rule has occurred, he shall report this to the PBR. The PBR will make a report of the incident, which should be submitted to the Philippine College of Radiology (PCR) Board of Directors. A copy of the report should be submitted to the Residency Training Council (RTC).
- 3) The investigation, final disposition on the matter, and penalties for the offence will depend on the PCR Board of Directors.
- 4) The examinee may submit a written appeal to the PCR Board of Directors
- 5) It is understood that the results of the examination herein, after due deliberations by the PBR, are strictly confidential, final and binding to all concerned parties.

PHILIPPINE BOARD OF RADIOLOGY BOARD RESOLUTION 2009-02 Rules Regarding Cheating and Other Violations of Examination Regulations

Section 1. Declaration of Policies.

The Philippine Board of Radiology has the responsibility of maintaining examination integrity so as to protect the quality of examinations and those who depend upon our integrity. It is the responsibility of the examinee to refrain from infractions of examination integrity, from conduct that may lead to suspicion of such infractions, and from conduct that aids others in such infractions. It is the responsibility of the examiner to establish and maintain an environment that supports examination integrity. An essential part of this examiner responsibility is the enforcement of existing standards and rules of examination integrity.

Examination integrity is a major part of the Philippine Board of Radiology (PBR) responsibility. In order to ensure examination standards, and to regulate the handling of cheating and other violations of examination regulations, the PBR Rules Regarding Cheating and Other Violations of Examination Regulations are set forth.

Section 2. Areas of Coverage

The Rules apply to the handling of all cases of examinees of the Philippine Board of Radiology who violate examination regulations and/or cheat in examinations.

Section 3. Definition of Violation of Examination Regulations

Examinees' non-compliance with examination regulations, disobeying the arrangements or instructions of examiners/invigilators/working staff, especially the following behavior, will be considered to be violation of examination regulations:

- 3.1 Bringing unauthorized articles into the examination venue or not placing articles at designated areas;
- 3.2 Failure to sit in designated seat;
- 3.3 Starting to work on the question paper before the examination starts or continuing to work on the question paper after the examination finishes;
- 3.4 Looking around during examinations, or attempting to view the examination papers of others;
- 3.5 Unauthorized loitering or remaining in the examination venue after submission of examination papers or making loud noises in the vicinity of the examination venue;

- 3.6 Entering or leaving the examination venue without the permission of invigilators;
- 3.7 Taking away from the examination venue any examination material, including examination papers, answer sheets, draft paper, etc;
- 3.8 Disobeying the instructions of invigilators/working staff, threatening and/or insulting invigilators/working staff, disturbing the order of the examination venue;
- 3.9 Other behaviour which disturbs the order of the examination;
- 3.10 Bribing or attempting to bribe, promising favors to, or making threats against any examiner/invigilator/working staff or other examinee with the intent to affect an examination performance. This includes an examinee who conspires with another person who then takes the action on behalf of the examinee.

Section 4. Definition of Cheating in Examinations

Examinees' improper behavior in examinations, especially the following, will be considered as cheating:

- 4.1 Any unauthorized papers and all kinds of information related to examinations found on the examination desks or surroundings, or with the examinees, regardless of such items being read or not;
- 4.2 Viewing other examinees' examination papers;
- 4.3 Copying or using other improper means to get access to other examinees' answers or answer information;
- 4.4 Assisting others in cheating;
- 4.5 Conspiring with another examinee to substitute him/her in examinations;
- 4.6 Using the opportunity of going to the washroom to view information related to the content of the examination, or to talk with other examinees outside the examination venue;
- 4.7 Improperly obtaining knowledge/information related to the examination papers before examinations;
- 4.8 Forging documents in order to take examinations and obtain examination results.

Section 5. Handling of Violation of Examination Regulations and Cheating in Examinations

- 5.1 In the case of an examinee who violates any of the regulations in Section 3 and Section 4, the invigilator should immediately give a verbal warning and correct the examinee's behaviour.
- 5.2 If the examinee disregards the verbal warning and continues or repeats the misbehavior, the members of the Philippine Board of Radiology should make a decision as to the immediate termination of the examinee's examination. If it is decided that the examinee's examination should be terminated immediately, the invigilator should take the examination paper, instruct the examinee to leave the examination venue, and mark "violation of examination regulations" or "cheating in examination" on the examination paper.
- 5.3 The Philippine Board of Radiology will make a report of the incident, which should be submitted to the Philippine College of Radiology (PCR) Board of Directors together with the related examination paper and other information. A copy of the report should be submitted to the Residency Training Council (RTC).
- 5.4 The investigation, final disposition on the matter, and penalties for the offence will depend on the PCR Board of Directors.
- 5.5 The examinee may submit a written appeal to the PCR Board of Directors.

Section 6. Recommended Penalties for Violating Examination Regulations and Cheating in Examinations

The following penalties may be imposed on a examinee who violates examination regulations and/or cheats in examinations:

- 6.1 A written reprimand;
- 6.2 A zero mark for the related examination; and recorded in the examinee's file;
- 6.3 Termination of part of the privileges of the offending examinee to the Philippine College of Radiology for a specified period;
- 6.4 Disqualification from sitting for other examinations in the related or other subjects of that Board Examination for a specified period;
- 6.5 First offenders shall be suspended from taking the board examination for a period of one year. The period of suspension starts from the date of execution of the penalties established by the PCR;
- 6.6 Serious (such as premeditated, conspiratorial and/or organized) or repeated offenders shall be suspended from taking the board examination for a period of no more than three years. The period of suspension starts from the date of execution of the penalties established by the PCR Board of Directors.

Section 7. Declaration

- 7.1 Anyone reporting the violation of examination regulations and/or cheating in examinations should provide his or her real name, give details of the incident and attach the related evidence.
- 7.2 In the event that the person reporting the incident does not provide his or her real name, the report shall be dismissed.
- 7.3 During the period of handling the report on the incident, the Philippine Board of Radiology (PBR), Residency Training Council (RTC), and Philippine College of Radiology (PCR) Board of Directors should keep the incident confidential before any decision is reached.

Section 8. Effective Date and Right of Interpretation

- 8.1 This regulation is approved by the Philippine College of Radiology (PCR) Board of Directors on May 9, 2009, and comes into effect in June 2009.
- 8.2 Any matters not covered in the present document shall be submitted to the PBR for discussion and recommendations, and handled according to the instructions of the PCR Board of Directors.

INDUCTION AS MEMBER OF THE PHILIPPINE COLLEGE OF RADIOLOGY

As per the requirement of the Philippine College of Radiology, all successful examinees who are due for Induction as members of the PCR as DIPLOMATES are required to register for the PCR Annual Convention, where the Induction ceremonies will be held. Those who are not registered for the PCR Annual Convention will not be Inducted as members of the Philippine College of Radiology.
